

## RED 101

"When people walk into a red room, they immediately respond," says New York City interior designer Scott Sanders. Color experts describe red as a stimulating shade. It grabs focus (think stop signs and fire engines) and, on walls, becomes the defining element of a space. High-octane orange-tinted tones (see right) make you feel energized and alive, while subtler, old-fashioned purplish shades—burgundy, maroon, brick—can evoke the cozy, insular vibe of, say, an 18th-century library. Either way, "red is a statement color," says New York City interior designer Janine Carendi MacMurray. So choose your reds carefully, and if you're risk averse, get your infusion through objects rather than paint.



## no-fail reds

It's not just the tone but also the finish that can make red paint perfect or problematic. Carendi MacMurray offers her top picks.



### LIVING ROOM

### FOYER

### ALCOVE

### DINING ROOM

### BOOKCASE INTERIOR

"A matte coat can add flair to a unit that's glossy white on the outside." *Ravishing Red 2008-10*, \$50 a gallon, benjaminmoore.com for stores.



### FLEA-MARKET FIND

"In a glossy finish, it will make a grannyish chair look cool and modern." *Habanero Chile 7589*, \$49 a gallon, sherwinwilliams.com for stores.



## red furniture

Because the color is so visually arresting, "even one red piece can transform a bland room," says Carendi MacMurray. Red furnishings work well with pale and dark neutrals—white walls, wood floors, natural stone—or as a rich matte counterpoint to metallics (see left).



### COTTON ARMCHAIR

Offset its masculine, angular lines with a round area rug.



### LACQUER CREDENZA

A sleek dining-room buffet or a pedestal for that fancy widescreen.



### STACKABLE UNIT

Use it to stash DVDs in the living room or toiletries in the bath.



### WOODEN SIDE TABLE

Top it with a pretty bowl to complement its curves.



### POLY-COTTON SOFA

Tailored and slightly retro, a steal of a statement piece.



### STEEL CABINET

Makes that Hummel collection look hip.

A cherry red bureau gives an alcove, which typically doesn't get much play, a reason for being.

### red accessories

As punctuation in a room of neutrals, red is an instant-makeover color capable of enlivening large areas with little effort. A rule: Pick one red and stick with it—competing tones can feel chaotic. And exercise restraint. Sprinkle reds here and there (not everywhere) for hits of color, rather than wallops.



#### GALVANIZED BIN

A whimsical touch in an all-white kitchen, or a cute kids' hamper.



#### COTTON-BLEND PILLOW

Perfect for making a formal sofa look a little less stiff.



#### MIDCENTURY-STYLE CLOCK

A look-at-me classic that makes wall art unnecessary.

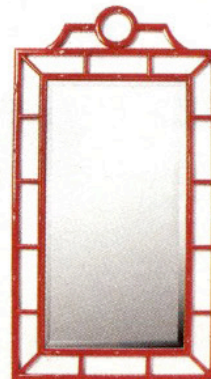
#### LACQUER LAMP
